ADULT EDUCATION

Bunker Hill Community College offers two Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) grant funded programs to assist adults in developing the necessary skills in English language proficiency, acquire a High School Credential (HiSET), and the skills to successfully complete college courses and receive six college program credits.

The Adult Education Program

The Adult Education program at the Chelsea Campus and the BHCC Boston Adult Education Consortium provide educational and support services for adults who lack English language and literacy skills and/or do not have a high school

diploma. This comprehensive program provides free educational services that include courses in Basic English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL), AE literacy and High School Equivalency Assessment (HiSET) preparation in Spanish and in English.

Classes are held in Chelsea and Boston. The ESOL and Spanish HiSET Adult Education courses are offered during the day, evening and Saturdays at the Chelsea Campus. The AE literacy, Pre-HiSET and HiSET Adult Education courses are held at LARE Institute, the College's program partner in Chelsea, the Boston Chinatown Neighborhood Center (BCNC), and Educational Development Group satellite locations around Boston.

Transitions to College Program

The Department of Education funded Transitions to College Program at BHCC, which enables students currently or previously enrolled in an adult education program to enroll in college-level courses by learning the essential skills needed to be a successful student. Students develop an education and career plan while enrolling into a program of study. The program is year-long and classes are offered at no cost to students (tuition, fees, and books are paid for).

Classes taken the first semester:

Fall semester courses (up to 9 credits):

- HUM 120-TC Self, Culture and Society (3 credits)
- CIT-110-TC Computer Applications and Concepts (3 credits)

Spring semester courses (up to 15 credits):

- Students are encouraged to take courses in their program of study {major} or prerequisites for higher level courses.
- Students will receive vouchers that will pay for 2 classes of their choice

Summer Semester: (up to 9 credits)

- Optional (If needed): Math course, MAT093, Foundations of Mathematics (3 credits)
- Optional (If needed): Integrated course, ELL102 or ELL103 (6 credits)

TECHNOLOGY AND CAREERS

Cybersecurity Training Certificate

If you are interested in Cybersecurity and you have computer experience, this program is for you. To determine if you qualify, please review the prerequisite requirement on our landing page https://www.bhcc.edu/corporatetraining/cybersecuritytrainingcertificate. You may not enroll in the program until you have submitted the required information.

There are two main courses in the program:

NON-108E "Cybersecurity: Immediate Immersion" – Thinking like an attacker and network traffic analysis

This course requires a textbook, which can be purchased at the publisher's website. Once registered, the book may be purchased here: https://nostarch.com/packetanalysis3.

NON-118E Cybersecurity Defense builds on the defensive skills and experience students gained in Immediate Immersion. The twelve-week course is designed to impart a strong foundation of defensive information security skills, preparing students for entry-level careers as security operations center analysts and digital forensics analysts. Students work through six online real-life tasks in a private cloud environment with help, advice and feedback from a knowledgeable mentor and extensive online learning resources. The tasks are embedded in the realistic, but fictional, context of work as an entry-level employee of a government cyber operations agency.

This course includes the following tasks:

- Analyze a remote intrusion attempt
- A security operations center analyst has seen evidence of a password cracking attempt within a key network. Students analyze a packet capture file and event logs within a security information and event management system (the Splunk SIEM) to determine if any passwords were compromised and if the network was breached as a result.
- Investigate an incident using a SIEM
- Students analyze a possible "watering hole" attack in which clicking on a malicious link embedded in an otherwise legitimate website

- launches an exploit kit that infects a user's machine with a "banking trojan."
- Compile indicators of compromise to guide forensic analysis
- Students use a "hash" of a possible malwarecontaining file to conduct research using VirusTotal, online sandboxes, and open source intelligence sources to determine specific indicators of compromise to guide forensic analysis of memory and file system images of infected devices.
- Examine a compromised host's memory
- Students perform a forensic examination of a memory image taken from a computer to identify sophisticated malware that infected the system.
- Conduct a forensic disk examination
- Students perform disk forensics on an infected system. By analyzing an image of the computer's file system, the students are able to identify malware infections and to create a timeline for the attack.
- Close your investigation
- Students are asked to conclude their investigation by compiling a timeline for the attack and writing a comprehensive report for technical and non-technical stakeholders.

Upon successful completion of the two courses, you will separately enroll in Udemy's 21-hour CompTIA Security course, which includes the SY0-601 exam. You will also purchase the full-length CompTIA Security+ (SY0-601) Practice Exams. Combined, your purchase of both the course and practice exams from Udemy will be about \$40.00*. *Please note: Prices are subject to change and BHCC has no control of the tuition cost charged by Udemy.

Udemy is a global teaching and learning platform that provides online video courses. You must continue your learning through Udemy immediately after successfully completing your 18-week training. The program's cybersecurity mentors will support you as you work through the Udemy course. In total, you are looking at 24 weeks, or six months, to complete the training and be ready to sit for the national exam. Once you pass the CompTIA Security exam, you will earn your industry-recognized credential. Cyber Attack and Defense: Immediate Immersion (Six Weeks) NON-108E

Immediate Immersion is designed to impart initial cybersecurity skills in six weeks of study at 25 hours per week to help students determine if careers in cybersecurity are right for them. Students work through three online real-life tasks (about two weeks per task).

Cybersecurity: Immediate Immersion includes the following tasks:

- Exploit a website (and fix its vulnerabilities)
- Insider threat?
- Analyze malicious network traffic

Immediate Immersion students are expected to spend 15 - 25 hours per week on the course. We have a one-hour Zoom meeting each week where everyone has a chance to discuss what they are working on, ask questions, and work together on the current task.

Immediate Immersion is a mentor-driven course. Students are not expected to get by entirely on their own. A significant amount of independent study is involved, but it's more like "assisted study." Outside of weekly meetings, mentors regularly communicate with students on Slack and assist them as needed as they progress through the course.

The program is part of Grow with Google, a Google initiative to help create economic opportunities for all Americans. Upon completion, students will be able to apply for entry level IT positions. This hybrid course allows you to learn asynchronously -- on your own -- and with the benefit of a dedicated instructor who will meet with the students over videoconferencing one night per week. Every word and sentence is also written out phonetically. This course has been carefully crafted to ensure you will have no trouble pronouncing French words correctly. The first three lessons introduce the basics needed for most conversations in French, such as "please" and "thank you." You will also learn numbers, days of the week, months of the year, and telling time.
