FREE TUITION

for community college

Mayor Walsh knows that college is too important to be limited to those who can afford it. That's why the City of Boston has committed to pay for up to three years of community college for eligible low-income students through its Tuition-Free Community College Plan.

AM I ELIGIBILE FOR THE PLAN?

To be eligible, you must:

- Be a Boston resident
- Graduate from a high school in Boston, graduate from high school as a METCO student, or earn your HiSET or GED
- Receive your high school credential within 12 months of starting the plan
- Have a GPA of at least 2.0*
- Require no more than three developmental courses by the start of the semester
- Be eligible for a Pell Grant, as determined by the FAFSA
- Have low to moderate household income, per HUD guidelines

ARE NON-US CITIZENS ELIGIBLE?

Even if they cannot apply for the Pell Grant, certain categories of non-US citizens – including DACA and TPS – remain eligible to receive financial support through the plan. Email TuitionFreeCollege@boston.gov to learn more.

WHICH COLLEGES DOES THE PLAN PAY FOR?

- Bunker Hill Community College (BHCC)
- MassBay Community College
- Roxbury Community College (RCC)
- Benjamin Franklin Institute of Technology (BFIT)

WHAT COSTS ARE COVERED AT THE COMMUNITY COLLEGES?

After the Pell Grant is applied, the Tuition-Free Community College Plan pays for **up to three years of remaining tuition and mandatory fees** at participating community colleges. Students whose tuition and fees are already fully covered by the Pell Grant may be able to receive up to \$1,000 over three semesters for college-related expenses instead.** Check the website below for updates.

WHAT COSTS ARE COVERED AT BFIT?

Benjamin Franklin Institute of Technology (BFIT) will cover up to three years of remaining tuition and mandatory fees for eligible students who are fully covered by the Pell Grant. These students may also receive up to \$1,000 over three semesters for college-related expenses.**

HOW DO I APPLY?

WHAT IS THE APPLICATION DEADLINE?

- August 15 for the Fall semester
- January 5 for the Spring semester

HOW DO I BECOME ELIGIBLE?

- Meet Tuition-Free Community College Plan requirements
- Have < 15 community college credits to start
- Finish your associate degree in 2.5 years
- Finish your bachelor's degree in 2 years
- Attend school continuously, full-time
- Maintain a cumulative 3.0 GPA
- Commit to one of the many popular majors listed atwww.bostonpublicschools.org/BostonBridge

HOW DO I APPLY?
