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MASSACHUSETTS COMMUNITY COLLEGE IN-STATE TUITION ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

MASSACHUSETTS HIGH SCHOOL COMPLETERS

To qualify for in-state tuition with "High School Completer" status, a student must meet all of the following criteria:

- ✓ has attended at least three years of high school in Massachusetts;
- has graduated from high school in Massachusetts or has received the equivalent of a high school diploma (for example, a GED or HiSet) in Massachusetts;
- does not have an ineligible non-immigrant status—typically meaning a foreign national with an official temporary status in the United States, such as diplomatic officials or someone authorized to be in the US under a work or visitor visa;
- ✓ has applied for military selective service if eligible;
- has provided an affidavit form stating that they will file an application to become a citizen or legal permanent resident within 120 days after becoming eligible to do so if the student does not have a Social Security number or individual tax ID number, or if the student is not a citizen or legal permanent resident of the United States.

NON-MASSACHUSETTS HIGH SCHOOL COMPLETERS

Students without the Massachusetts "High School Completer" status must meet all of the following criteria:

- ✓ is a U.S. Citizen, permanent resident, or has an eligible immigration status from the list below and has provided supporting documents;
- has demonstrated their intent to remain in Massachusetts by providing two (2) documents from the list on the other side of this form.
- ✓ has resided in Massachusetts for a minimum of six (6) months prior to the start of the semester or term.*

*Veterans, members of the armed forces, and their spouses and dependents may be exempt from this requirement. Please email our Veterans Center at VCenter@bhcc.edu for more information.

DOCUMENTS ESTABLISHING CITIZENSHIP OR ELIGIBLE IMMIGRATION STATUS

All documents presented must be valid. If a document has expired, it may not be considered in determining in-state tuition eligibility.

- Resident Alien (student must submit copy of resident alien card)
- o U.S. permanent resident with I-151, I-551, and I-551C forms (students must submit INS documentation)
- I-94 from the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service with one of the following designations stamped on the card: refugee; Cuban-Haitian entrant status pending; asylum granted; indefinite parole; or humanitarian parole (student must submit passport or INS documentation).
- o Non-citizen who is in (or who is eligible to apply and who has applied for) refugee/asylum status
- o Resident Alien Card
- o Temporary Resident Identification Card
- I-94 Record of Arrival and Departure*
- Processed for I-551 stamp in a foreign passport
- Permanent Resident Re-entry Permit
- Refugee Travel Document
- Employment Authorization Document (EAD)*
- Notice of Action, Form 1-797*
- Parole Authorization
- o USCIS Letter Granting Asylum
- USCIS Letter Approving Permanent Residence Status
- o USCIS Letter Granting Cancellation of Removal under NACARA
- Immigration Judge Order Granting Relief under the Convention Against Torture, Withholding of Removal, Asylum, Cancellation of Removal, Suspension of Deportation; Temporary Protected Status; Adjustment of Status
- US Dept Health and Human Services Certification Letter issued pursuant to Trafficking Victims Protection Act
- Non-immigrant visa stamp (in foreign passport or travel document) indicating "A,", "E," "G," "H," "I," "K," "L,"
 "N," "O," "R," "S," "T," "U," "V," and other non-immigrant visas or statuses that USCIS may add in the future in which intent to reside in MA is not prohibited.
- Documents specific to the applicant based upon decisions of a federal court or of the U.S. Department of State, U.S. Department of Justice (including Executive Office for Immigration review, Board of Immigration Appeals and former Immigration and Naturalization Service), or U.S. Department of Homeland Security (including U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services).

*If the document submitted is Form 1-94 Record of Arrival and Departure or Form 1-797, Notice of Action, and relates to a B, C, D, F, J, M, P or Q visa, or if the document submitted is an employment authorization card, and contains the category (C031 Student Optional or Curricula practical training), then alternative qualifying documentation should be presented. If no additional documentation is presented, then the student is not eligible for further consideration for in-state tuition.
