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

# Transfer to BHCC

Have you studied at another college or university?



If you previously studied at another college or university, you must have your institution submit your official transcript(s) to receive transfer credit. If your official transcripts haven't been submitted yet, you can still register for classes today using a copy of your transcript. An advisor will review the courses you've previously completed and help you plan and register for BHCC courses. <u>Be</u> sure to tell your advisor about every college you studied at so you don't register for a course that you may have already taken.

Did you study at a college or university outside of the United States? We transfer credit from universities all over the world. To receive transfer credit and assistance with planning and registering for courses, you must have a course-by-course evaluation from a third-party education evaluation service.
