- Students interested in the Basic English Language Learning (BELL) Program will take the WritePlacer ESL and ESL Reading tests.
- Students testing for Selective Health Sciences programs or for F1 Visa Language Proficiency will answer a short series of background questions to determine which set of tests they take—ESL or English. These are the questions:
   Is English the only language you speak?
  - the only language you speak?
    - → YES: Start with WritePlacer.
    - → NO: Have you studied English for six years or more in the U.S. or in a country where English is the primary language of instruction?
      - $\rightarrow$  NO: Start with WritePlacer ESL.
      - $\rightarrow$  YES: Do you speak, read, and write English daily?
        - → YES: Start with WritePlacer.
        - → NO: Start with WritePlacer ESL.
