BHCC values international students

Since its founding in 1973, BHCC has made international education a priority. Our institution has a national reputation for serving students from around the world. We value and appreciate the worldwide perspective that international students bring to us. International students play a central role in the College community, and it's easy for international students to get involved in campus life and make life-long friends.







Outstanding academic programs and dedicated faculty

BHCC offers more than 100 associate degree and certificate programs that enable students to complete the first two years of a bachelor's degree and then they transfer to universities for the final two years. Articulation agreements between BHCC and public and private universities make it easy to transfer, and transfer counselors help at every step of the way.

Academic excellence is important at BHCC. We offer a dynamic Honors program, an award-winning Honor Society and assistance in transferring to top universities after graduation.

BHCC also has options for students who do not wish to go on for a bachelor's degree. Students can enroll in either an associate degree program or pursue one of nearly 50 certificate programs.

At many universities, introductory level courses students take in the first two years are taught by teaching assistants. These teaching assistants are actually students pursuing their graduate degrees. At BHCC, all of your professors will have advanced degrees and extensive teaching experience.

Location

BHCC is located in Boston, Massachusetts, the cultural and historic center of New England. Our Charlestown Campus is only a ten-minute drive from downtown Boston and the city's many cultural, historical, entertainment and sporting events centers. BHCC has its own subway stop, making it easy to get around the city. Boston has the largest number of colleges, universities and medical centers in the United States. Many large corporations, as well as small technology-driven firms, are located in Boston. BHCC's students love the international environment of Boston.

individualized attention

BHCC will help you succeed. We have an outstanding English as a Second Language program with many levels of instruction. If you are not totally ready for academic coursework, you can enroll in innovative "paired courses" that combine an academic course with ESL support. Students can obtain free tutoring in almost all subject areas at the Tutoring and Academic Support Center. The Student Health Center provides healthcare and health education.

The average class size at BHCC is 20 students. This is very different from the size of introductory classes at many universities, which often have 100-200 students. At BHCC,

your professors will know your name and where you are from by the end of the first week. Your professors and advisors will know you well enough to help you choose the best university when it's time to transfer.

BHCC also offers the state-of-theart LifeMap. LifeMap is a program and a process that is dedicated to promoting student success in educational, career and life goals. LifeMap utilizes technology combined with personal attention students receive from faculty and staff to ensure a positive and productive post-secondary educational experience. The BHCC portal allows students to access the many technological components contained in LifeMap, including email, career planning tools, ePortfolio, advising and counseling information, financial planning and information regarding support services on and off campus.

BHCC faculty and staff provide students the individual attention and support required to fulfill their personal and educational goals.



The International Center and services for students





Established in 1999, the International Center coordinates international education activities at Bunker Hill Community College and provides programs, services and activities designed to further the internationalization of the BHCC community.

The International Center provides a focus for all international activities at BHCC and serves as a "home away from home" for international students. The Center coordinates orientation programs for new international students and assists students in obtaining homestays with American families or offcampus housing. Professional international student advisors help students adjust to college life in the United States and provide counseling on immigration, academic and personal concerns.

International student services

New students participate in orientation programs to help them adjust to the U.S. culture and educational system and to student life in Boston. Students can obtain advice on current immigration regulations relating to visas, change of immigration status, school transfers, work permission, practical training and travel to other countries. International student advisors also serve as counselors to discuss academic matters and personal issues such as adjustment to living in the United States.

International student admissions

Students who wish to attend BHCC on an international student (F-1) visa apply through the International Center. Applicants must have







completed secondary school and must demonstrate evidence of English proficiency. The student or sponsor must demonstrate that sufficient funds are available to cover the cost of educational and living expenses.

Study abroad scholarships

With funding from BHCC and the Student Government Association, the International Center coordinates an annual study abroad scholarship program. Students can apply to study in a variety of countries for periods ranging from two to eight weeks. Applicants must be matriculated into a program and must have completed 12 academic credits at BHCC with a grade point average of 2.5 or higher. Approximately 35 scholarships,

covering 80 percent of the total program costs, are awarded each year. The application deadline is usually the fourth week of October.

Intercultural programs and activities

The International Center regularly coordinates cultural and educational programs designed to assist the College community in learning more about our rapidly shrinking world. These programs frequently feature BHCC faculty, staff and students who have international and intercultural experience. Many international visitors to BHCC are hosted by the International Center each year.

Faculty and curriculum development programs

The International Center coordinates a number of international programs and activities that enable faculty and students to participate in diverse programs. The Center also provides support to faculty developing new international courses and updating their courses to include a global perspective.
